Clean, groomed, and general appearance 20 pts- Equipment and Tack

- Q: How many terms can a Board Member serve?
- A: Team Purebred Junior Board Members are eligible to serve two terms. Board members are eligible to run for re-election at the completion of serving their first term.
- Q: When are Jr. Board Member Applications due?
- A: Applications need to be returned to the Team Purebred office by May 20th, 2006

Swine Issues Contest-Senior Exhibitors Only

Participants will...

- -Meet after Mandatory Exhibitor Meeting (Wednesday, June 28th at 2 pm) to draw for order of presentation.
- -Draw three topics relating to current swine issues, participants will be able to select which 1 they will present to a panel of judges.
- -Participant will have 15 minutes to prepare a 3-5 minute speech on selected topic of choice
- -At the end of the speech, judges will have 3-5 minutes to ask questions.
- -Participants will be awarded a score based on topic knowledge and speaking ability.

Skill-a-Thon Contest

Skill-a-Thon is a fun way to test your agriculture knowledge and skills! ! Don't miss this opportunity to learn more about your swine project while having fun.

- -Each age division will have a written test and skill stations that will be appropriate for each age division.
- -Items that may be included (but not limited to) are..
 - -Breed Identification
 - -Feed Identification -Parts of a Pig -Pedigree Questions -Quality Assurance
 - -Animal Husbandry -Ethics

Judging Contest

Friday, June 30th at 1 pm Novice at 4 pm

-Ear Notching

Don't miss this opportunity to show off your judging skills!! Novice Judgers will:

- -Participate in short teaching session before 1st class.
- -Judge two classes and answer questions for one class.

Junior Judgers will:

-Judge four classes with one class having questions.

Intermediate Judgers will:

- -Judge four classes with one class having questions.
- -Give one set of reasons.

Senior Judgers will:

- -Judge four classes with one class having questions.
- -Give two sets of reasons.

Parents are NOT allowed near the judging rings. Assistants will be available to novice or first-time participants who may not understand how to mark their cards. No talking is allowed during the judging contest.

Scholarship Sweepstakes

Team Purebred will award three scholarships at the 2006 Summer Show totaling \$2,250. Scholarships will be \$1,000, \$750, and \$500 which will be awarded based on scores in the following activities.

> Skill-a-thon Showmanship Judging Contest Swine Issues

To be eligible for the Scholarship Sweepstakes you must:

- Be a paid member of Team Purebred
- Be 17-21 years of age (as of January 1, 2006) and
- Enter and show at least one hog at the 2006 Team Purebred Summer Event.

Junior member may only receive up to \$1,000 during the course of their years of participation. Scholarship is payable upon acceptance to any college or tech school (copy of acceptance must be submitted to Team Purebred before money will be dispersed)

Photography

- 1. All photos must be the work of the exhibitor and be taken by the contestant during the past year. (Past year includes the time from Summer Conference 2005 to present)
- 2. Each contestant may have a maximum of four entries.
- 3. The theme for the 2006 photography contest is "Paradise"
- 4. Photos must meet the following requirements:

Entries should be a 5 x 7-inch color or black and white print. Entries are to be mounted on a 6x8-inch piece of black poster board. Entries should not have dates printed on front of photo.

Have entry blank on back side, upper left hand corner of entry.

Above requirements must be finished BEFORE they are presented for entry.

- 5. No professional matting or framing is allowed.
- 6. No decoration or writing on frames or mats will be allowed.
- 7. Photo cannot be altered or image-enhanced.
- 8. Contestants are encouraged to use 35-mm cameras, not digital cameras. However, when using a digital camera, contestant must print the photograph on photo paper.
- 9. All photographs become property of Team Purebred at time of entry.
- 10. Entry blanks are available below, on the web site, in Breeder's Digest magazine or by contacting Amy Jo or a Junior Board Member.

Summer Conference Contest Reminder:

For those youth that do not show a barrow/gilt at Summer Conference, you may still participate in showmanship, judging contest, skill-athon, photo contest and/or swine issues (Senior Exhibitors) by paying a \$5.00 participation fee plus your Team Purebred dues if you are not a current member. This can be done by filling out an entry form prior to Summer Conference or see Amy Jo, Junior Coordinator to take advantage of this opportunity.

Team Purebred Goals

The Team Purebred Junior Board of Directors met at their annual Leadership Retreat and have set forth the following goals for the Team Purebred Association for 2006.

- -Increase membership to 500, reaching members from across the United States.
- -Encourage more membership involvement in organizing and helping at events.
- -Increase interest in leadership roles, encouraging members to take active roles in Association.
- -Diversify regional events, outreaching to new areas and new shows.

2006 Team Purebred National Junior Summer Show Rules Barrow and Gilt Show

Eligibility:

- 1. All exhibitors and participants must be members of Team Purebred.
- 2. Exhibitors must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2006.
- 3. There will be no gilt or barrow entries accepted at the show, entries must be postmarked by May 20th to the Team Purebred Office.
- 4. If an exhibitor is not present to show their barrow/gilt, the hog cannot be exhibited without prior approval from Team Purebred Junior Coordinator.

Requirements:

- 1. Gilt and barrow entries must be registered Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China or Spotted Swine farrowed December 1, 2005 and after.
- 2. Entries may be purchased animals, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name 60 days or more prior to the show (on or before April 28, 2006). Entries must be registered and/or transferred prior to the show.
- 3. Junior exhibitors must bring their original pedigree and a **copy of their pedigree to check-in**. We will check the original and return it to you, however we will keep the copy to use during the shows. Substitutions will be allowed at the show.
- 4. The earliest any junior hogs will be released from the barn is Friday, June 30 at 7:00 p.m.—NO EXCEPTIONS. We strongly encourage all participants to stay for the Family Fun Night on Friday, June 30th, and the awards presentation and sales on Saturday, July 1st
- 5. All exhibitors must allow their hogs to be used for the judging contest if selected by Judging Officials or Team Purebred Board Members.

Gilt Exhibitors:

- 1. Breed classes will be broken according to farrowing dates, with proportional classes.
- 2. Gilts shown in the Junior show are eligible to be exhibited in the open shows and sold as long as they are double entered in the name of the junior exhibitor (same name for both shows). They must be entered in the open show by the entry deadline (June 1) and gilt must be sold.
- 3. All entries must meet Breed classification standards.
- 4. All Berkshire and Chester White breeding gilts are guaranteed to be stress free. All Berkshires must have the negative stress status denoted on the pedigree.
- 5. Females that are entered in the open show (must double enter) must meet all the requirements that are printed in the rules and regulations for that event. Example: Spotted gilts must be DNA stress identified on the pedigree.

Barrow Exhibitors:

- This is a non-terminal show—exhibitors are responsible for their own barrows.
 - 2. Barrows must be farrowed Dec. 1, 2005 and after.
 - 3. Barrows will be shown by weight.
 - 4. All entries must meet Breed classification standards.
 - 5. All Berkshires must have the negative stress status denoted on the pedigree.

All Junior Hogs will be classified by a 'Classification Team' appointed by the respective board presidents. Barrows will be classified at weigh-in and gilts will be classified at their pens. Exhibitors should be around pens when gilts are classified, immediately following barrow weigh in.

2006 Team Purebred National Junior Summer Show Rules

Gilt & Barrow Shows

Eligibility:

- 1. All exhibitors and participants must be members of Team Purebred.
- 2. Exhibitors must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2006.
- 3. There will be no gilt or barrow entries accepted at the show, entries must be postmarked by May 20th to the Team Purebred Office.
- 4. If an exhibitor is not present to show their barrow/gilt, the hog cannot be exhibited without prior approval from Junior Coordinator.

Requirements:

- 1. Gilt and barrow entries must be registered Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China or Spotted Swine farrowed December 1, 2005 and after.
- 2. Entries may be purchased animals, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name 60 days or more prior to the show (on or before April 28, 2006). Entries must be registered and/or transferred prior to the show.
- 3. Junior exhibitors must bring their original pedigree and a <u>copy of their pedigree to check-in</u>. We will check the original and return it to you, however we will keep the copy to use during the shows. Substitutions will be allowed at the show.
- 4. The earliest any junior hogs will be released from the barn is Friday, June 30 at 7:00 p.m.—NO EXCEPTIONS. We strongly encourage all participants to stay for the Family Fun Night on Friday, June 30th, and the awards presentation and sales on Saturday, July 1st
- 5. All exhibitors must allow their hogs to be used for the judging contest if selected by Judging Officials or Team Purebred Board Members.

Gilt Exhibitors:

- 1. Breed classes will be broken according to farrowing dates, with class size as equal as possible.
- 2. Gilts shown in the Junior show are eligible to be exhibited in the open shows and sold as long as they are double entered in the name of the junior exhibitor (same name for both shows). They must be entered in the open show by the entry deadline (June 1) and gilt must be sold.
- 3. All entries must meet Breed classification standards. Call for details if you're not sure of these rules.
- 4. All Berkshire and Chester White breeding gilts are guaranteed to be stress free.
- 5. Females that are entered in the open show (must double enter) must meet all the requirements that are printed in the rules and regulations for that event. Example: Spotted gilts must be DNA stress identified on the pedigree.

Barrow Exhibitors:

- 1. This is a non-terminal show—exhibitors are responsible for their own barrows.
- 2. Barrows must be farrowed Dec. 1, 2005 and after.
- 3. Barrows will be shown by weight.
- 4. All entries must meet Breed classification standards. Call for details if you're not sure of these rules.
- 5. Berkshire barrows need not be tested negative for stress. All Berkshires must have the negative stress status denoted on the pedigree.

All Junior Hogs will be classified by a 'Classification Team" appointed by the respective board presidents. Barrows will be classified at weigh-in and gilts will be classified at their pens. Classification will be done by a chip process with each classifier receiving a red and black chip. For each hog, the classifiers will put one of the chips in a can - a black chip mean the hog meets breed standards and is ok while a red chip indicates the hog does not meet breed classification standards.
