



JR. Beatty Memorial Herdsman Award "Remembering a Legend"

J. Robert Beatty was truly a legend to the purebred swine industry. Beatty was an industry leader helping organize the National and Illinois Pork Producers Councils, The National Pork Checkoff Program and was an active member of the Poland China Record Association serving on the Board of Directors for several years.

To remember this legend, a JR Beatty Award has been set up. The award is presented to a Team Purebred member, who participates in the Team Purebred National Jr. Show. The recipient receives a cane and \$250.00 buying credit that can be used to purchase a Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China, or Spot hog at any CPS or ABA National Show or Sale and the money must be used within a 12 month period following the Summer Type Conference.

- Q: How many terms can a Board Member serve?

- Q: When are Jr. Board Member Applications due?
- A: Applications need to be returned to the Team Purebred office by May 10, 2007.

Participants will...

- -Draw three topics relating to current swine issues, participants will be able to select which 1 they will present to a panel of judges.
- -Participant will have 15 minutes to prepare a 3-5 minute speech on selected topic of choice
- -At the end of the speech, judges will have 3-5 minutes to ask questions.
- -Participants will be awarded a score based on topic knowledge and speaking ability.

Judging Contest

Friday, June 29th at 1 pm Novice at 4 pm

Don't miss this opportunity to show off your judging skills!! Novice Judgers will:

- -Participate in short teaching session before 1st class.
- -Judge two classes and answer questions for one class.

Junior Judgers will:

-Judge four classes with one class having questions.

Intermediate Judgers will:

- -Judge four classes with one class having questions.
- -Give one set of reasons.

Senior Judgers will:

- -Judge four classes with one class having questions.
- -Give two sets of reasons.

Parents are NOT allowed near the judging rings. Assistants will be available to novice or first-time participants who may not understand how to mark their cards. No talking is allowed during the judging contest.

Scholarship Sweepstakes

Team Purebred will award three scholarships at the 2007 Summer Show totaling \$2,250. Scholarships will be \$1,000, \$750, and \$500 which will be awarded based on scores in the following activities.

Skill-a-thon Showmanship
Judging Contest Swine Issues

To be eligible for the Scholarship Sweepstakes you must:

- Be a paid member of Team Purebred
- ♦ Be 17-21 years of age (as of January 1, 2007) and
- ♦ Enter and show at least one hog at the 2007 Team Purebred Summer Event.

Junior member may only receive up to \$1,000 during the course of their years of participation. Scholarship is payable upon acceptance to any college or tech school (copy of acceptance must be submitted to Team Purebred before money will be dispersed)

Photography

- All photos must be the work of the exhibitor and be taken by the contestant during the past year. (Past year includes the time from Summer Conference 2006 to present)
- 2. Each contestant may have a maximum of four entries.
- 3. The theme for the 2007 photography contest is "All American"
- 4. Photos must meet the following requirements:

Entries should be a 5 x 7-inch color or black and white print.

Entries are to be mounted on a **6x8-inch piece of black poster board**.

Entries should not have dates printed on front of photo.

Have entry blank on back side, upper left hand corner of entry.

Above requirements must be finished BEFORE they are presented for entry.

- 5. No professional matting or framing is allowed.
- 6. No decoration or writing on frames or mats will be allowed.
- 7. Photo cannot be altered or image-enhanced.
- Contestants are encouraged to use 35-mm cameras, not digital cameras. However, when using a digital camera, contestant must print the photograph on photo paper.
- 9. All photographs become property of Team Purebred at time of entry.
- 10. Entry blanks are available below, on the web site, in Breeder's Digest magazine or by contacting Shari or a Junior Board Member.

For those youth that do not show a barrow/gilt at Summer Conference, you may still participate in showmanship, judging contest, skill-athon, photo contest and/or swine issues (Senior Exhibitors) by paying a \$5.00 participation fee plus your Team Purebred dues if you are not a current member. This can be done by filling out an entry form prior to Summer Conference or see Shari, Junior Coordinator to take advantage of this opportunity.

TEAM PUREBRED GOALS

The Team Purebred Junior Board of Directors met at their annual Leadership Retreat and have set forth the following goals for the Team Purebred Association for 2007.

- -Be able to add more shows to meet the needs of exhibitors across the country.
- -Increase industry exposure by using magazine, website and banner advertisement.
- -Provide new leadership opportunities for younger members.

2007 WORLD PORK EXPO NEW THIS YEAR SWEEPSTAKES & POSTER CONTEST

Team Purebred Sweepstakes Contest:

- 1. All contestants must be members of Team Purebred.
- 2. Sweepstakes contestants must declare their intent to compete in the sweepstakes contest at registration in order to receive points.
- 3. Sweepstakes contestants must compete in all four contests. The exhibitor must show a purebred Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China or Spotted gilt or barrow, compete in the showmanship contest, judging contest and poster contest.
- 4. Points will be distributed from the hog show, showmanship contest, judging contest and poster contest. Ties will be broken as follows: judging contest, showmanship, poster contest.
- 5. Sweepstakes points will be awarded as follows:

Participation in Gilt or Barrow Show: 100 points

Poster Contest: 1st: 100 points, 2nd: 90, 3rd: 80, 4th:70, 5th: 60, 6th:-participation: 50


Showmanship: 1st: 100 points, 2nd: 95, 3rd: 90, 4th: 85, 5th: 80, 6th: 75,

7th: 70, 8th: 65, 9th: 60, 10th: 55, 11th-participation: 50

Judging Contest: 1st: 100 points, 2nd: 95, 3rd: 90, 4th: 85, 5th: 80, 6th: 75, 7th: 70, 8th: 65, 9th: 60, 10th: 55, 11th-participation: 50

Team Purebred Poster Contest Rules:

- All contestants must be members of Team Purebred.
- Must compete in poster contest in order to be eligible for Sweepstakes Contest and awards.
- 3. Theme will be "Why Team Purebred." This is open to your interpretation of why you joined Team Purebred and what the group means to you!
- 4. Posters shall be no bigger than 4'x4' and can be any color, shape or texture you wish. May include graphic designs.
- 5. The 1st place poster from each age division will be displayed, with the winner's name, at all Team Purebred events for the remainder of the year!



2007 Team Purebred National Junior Summer Show Rules

Gilt & Barrow Shows

Eligibility:

- 1. All exhibitors and participants must be members of Team Purebred.
- 2. Exhibitors must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2007.
- 3. There will be no gilt or barrow entries accepted at the show, entries must be postmarked by May 10, 2007 to the Team Purebred Office.
- 4. If an exhibitor is not present to show their barrow/gilt, the hog cannot be exhibited without prior approval from Junior Coordinator.

Requirements:

- 1. Gilt and barrow entries must be registered Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China or Spotted Swine farrowed December 1, 2006 and after.
- 2. Entries may be purchased animals, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name 60 days or more prior to the show (on or before April 26, 2007). Entries must be registered and/or transferred prior to the show.
- 3. Junior exhibitors must bring their original pedigree and a <u>copy of their pedigree to check-in</u>. We will check the original and return it to you, however we will keep the copy to use during the shows. Substitutions will be allowed at the show.
- 4. The earliest any junior hogs will be released from the barn is Friday, June 29 at 7:00 p.m.—NO EXCEPTIONS. We strongly encourage all exhibitors to stay that evening for the Sweepstakes awards and sale of the Foundation Female as well as the Trailer Giveaway and Banner Auction the following morning. **Team Purebred has the right to withhold premiums from any exhibitor who leaves the grounds early without prior permission.**
- 5. All exhibitors must allow their hogs to be used for the judging contest if selected by Judging Officials or Team Purebred Board Members.
- 6. Exhibiting a gilt or barrow will make an exhibitor eligible for the sweepstakes competition.
- 7. Powdering, oiling, or any other show dressing other than water applied to hogs at Team Purebred events will not be allowed. Show officials reserve the right to disqualify any animal from competition not meeting the requirement. No clipping will be allowed in the barns at Team Purebred competitions.

Gilt Exhibitors:

- 1. Breed classes will be broken according to farrowing dates, with class size as equal as possible.
- 2. Gilts shown in the Junior show are eligible to be exhibited in the open shows and sold as long as they are double entered in the name of the junior exhibitor (same name for both shows). They must be entered in the open show by the entry deadline and gilt must go through the sale.
- 3. All entries must meet Breed classification standards. Call for details if you're not sure of these rules.
- 4. Chester White breeding gilts are guaranteed to be stress free.
- 5. Berkshire breeding gilts must be stress negative and have the negative stress status denoted on the pedigree.
- 6. Females that are entered in the open show (must double enter) must meet all the requirements that are printed in the rules and regulations for that event. Example: Spotted gilts must be DNA stress identified on the pedigree.
- 7. All junior show gilts are guaranteed to be open. Team Purebred has the right to pregnancy check any gilt. Any gilt found to be bred at the show, will forfeit all premium money and placing; and will be subject to being banned from all Team Purebred events for the next two years.

Barrow Exhibitors:

- 1. This is a non-terminal show—exhibitors are responsible for their own barrows.
- 2. Barrows must be farrowed Dec. 1, 2006 and after.
- 3. Barrows will be shown by weight.
- 4. All entries must meet Breed classification standards. Call for details if you're not sure of these rules.
- 5. All Berkshire barrows must be stress negative and have the negative stress status denoted on the pedigree.

All Junior Hogs will be classified by a 'Classification Team" appointed by the respective board presidents. Barrows will be classified at weigh-in and gilts will be classified at their pens. Classification will be done by a chip process with each classifier receiving a red and black chip. For each hog, the classifiers will put one of the chips in a can - a black chip mean the hog meets breed standards and is ok while a red chip indicates the hog does not meet breed classification standards.
